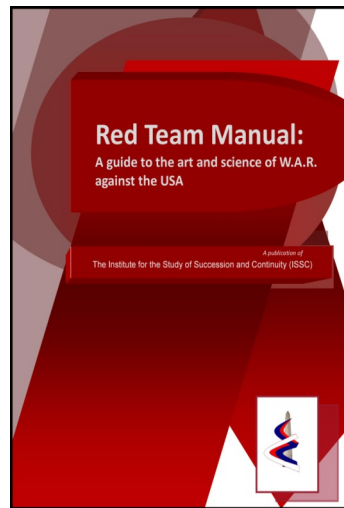
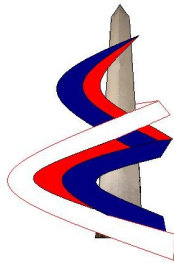
We are organizing "Red Teams" at major colleges, universities, and metropolitan areas all over the United States.

Needless to say, Red Teaming is a widely-accepted facet of global security and national defense, from the US Armed Forces to the Intelligence Community.
